# MINUTES POINTE COUPEE PARISH POLICE JURY November 13, 2012

The Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury met in regular session at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 13, 2012, at the Courthouse Annex in New Roads, Louisiana.

#### **INTRODUCTION OF 2013 BUDGET**

CPA Tommy LeJeune of Faulk and Winkler, LLC gave an introduction and a brief overview of the 2013 Budget of the Police Jury.

Motion by Mr. Cox and seconded by Mrs. Vosburg:

RESOLVED, That upon introduction of the 2013 Budget of the Police Jury that a public hearing be scheduled for Tuesday, December 11, 2012 at 5:00 p.m. to review and adopt the budget.

The Jury agreed to introduce an ordinance to consider implementing a Drainage Impact Fee and a 4% increase in gas and solid waste user fees at their December 11, 2012 meeting.

### AN ORDINANCE

To amend Chapter 15 of the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana to regulate the discharge of firearms within certain areas, to provide penalties and to further provide with respect thereto.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana:

Section 1. Chapter 15 of the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana, is hereby amended and re-ordained so as to add thereto a new section to be designated as Section 15-12 to read as follows, viz:

Section 15-12. Regulation of the discharge of firearms.

#### A. Definitions

1. Firearms: Guns, pistols, revolvers, rifles, shotguns and other barreled weapons which utilize combustible propellants.

### 2. Prohibited Areas:

- (a) Any public park, play ground, school, church or other public gathering places used by the public;
- (b) Any public street or roadway; and
- ©) Within 500 feet of any residence.
- 3. Law Enforcement Officers: Law enforcement officers of any governmental agency, federal, state, parish and/or municipal, legal recognized military organization and private employed security personnel and others who are authorized to carry firearms in the performance of their official duties.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any firearm within a prohibited area as defined herein, except by law enforcement officers when in performance of their duties, and except other persons acting in the necessary defense of life or property.
- C. Any person violating any provision of this section shall upon conviction be fined not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days, or both.
- Section 2. If any section, part, paragraph, sentence or clause of this ordinance should be declared invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or defect shall not affect the remaining sections, paragraphs, parts, sentences, or clauses hereof and, to this end, the several provisions hereof are declared to be severable.
  - Section 3. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Unanimously carried.

# INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 10 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE NATURAL GAS POLICY, RATES AND CHARGES

At the request of Juror Cox, Parish Administrator Bello introduced the following ordinance for consideration of the Jury and schedule a public hearing at their next meeting.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the following ordinance has been introduced before the

Police Jury of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana, and that a public hearing will be held relative thereto at 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, December 11, 2012, at the Police Jury Meeting Room, Courthouse Annex, 160 East Main Street, New Roads, Louisiana, after which said ordinance may be considered for adoption. All interested persons are urged to attend.

#### AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance amending Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinance of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana, establishing user rates and related requirements relative to the Pointe Coupee Parish Natural Gas System, and further providing with respect thereto.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana:

Section 1. Article I of Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinance of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana, is hereby amended by adding the following Sections thereto, viz:

Sec. 10-1. Meters Required.

All premises, residential or commercial, using the parish natural gas system shall be equipped with adequate natural gas meter(s) furnished by the Police Jury but paid for by the consumer in the tap fee.

Sec. 10-2. Service by Authorized Personnel Only.

Only personnel authorized by the parish may make any connection to or tamper in any way with any natural gas line between the source of natural gas and a customer service valve.

Sec. 10-3. Rates.

The natural gas rates and charges to all natural gas customers or users of the parish natural gas system shall be as set by the Police Jury from time to time to assure safety and maintenance of the system. The following rates are hereby established:

- · All natural gas service connections will be charged a flat minimum rate per connection in the amount of \$10.00 per month. Consumers will be billed \$3.135 per MCF used, plus the current cost per MCF.
- · Additional charges to the flat minimum rate are as follows.
  - o Late Penalty Charge of 10% of balance due accessed for any outstanding past due balance.
  - o Disconnect Charge \$10.00
  - o Reconnect Charge \$40.00 first notice, \$60.00 for second notice & \$80.00 for third notice.
  - o To connect natural gas, all fees owed to the Police Jury for said property must be paid in full.
  - o Tap fee \$150.00
  - o Meter Deposit \$125.00
- Charges for services will be assessed on the 12<sup>th</sup> of the month for customers of Natural Gas Utility 1 each month and are due by the 22<sup>nd</sup> of that month. Charges for services will be assessed on the 8<sup>th</sup> of the month for customers of Natural Gas Utility 2 each month and are due by the 18<sup>th</sup> of that month. If there is a balance due on the 23<sup>rd</sup> for customers of Natural Gas Utility 1 or 19<sup>th</sup> for customers of Natural Gas Utility 2, a late penalty fee will be assessed. If an account has a balance due in excess of 2 billing cycles of a month, a shutoff notice will be sent to the customer. The bill must be paid in full by the last day of the month at 1pm in order to avoid service disconnection. If a service is disconnected due to failure to pay as stated above, the balance due, disconnect, and reconnect charges

must be paid in full before service is reconnected. The new monthly charge will be assessed when the natural gas is reconnected. There are no prorated charges/adjustments.

Sec. 10-4. Deposits.

A service deposit as set by the Police Jury from time to time shall be paid prior to service installation to insure payment of all bills. When service to the applicant is discontinued permanently, this deposit, less any amount still due for natural gas service, shall be refunded without interest.

Section 2. If any section, part, paragraph, sentence or clause of this ordinance should be declared invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or defect shall not affect the remaining sections, paragraphs, parts, sentences, or clauses hereof and, to this end, the several provisions hereof are declared to be severable.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Unanimously carried.

### CONCERNS ABOUT POLLING PLACE AT WATERLOO FIRE STATION AT VENTRESS

Juror Nelson reported on concerns and an incident that occurred at the polling place at Waterloo Fire Station at Ventress on November 6, 2012. Messrs. Lawrence Smith, Greg Johnson, Roosevelt Gremillion and Chris Houston, members of Fire District No. 5 Board, appeared before the Jury to address the concerns. Juror Nelson reported on the fire department honoring the signed agreement with members of Fire District No. 5 Board of Commissioners allowing the Jury access to the fire station a week prior to an election.

#### AWARD BID FOR CDBG-DRA VILLAGE OF MORGANZA SEWER POND RESTORATION

Mrs. Karla Weston of Civil Design & Construction, Inc. reported and presented the following resolution for approval:

WHEREAS, the Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury received the following Bids on Monday, October 22, 2012 for the Morganza Sewer Pond Restoration, OCD/DRU Project No. 39PARA2303:

WHEREAS, the Bids have been checked and tabulated by Civil Design and Construction, Inc., with a recommendation of award being made to the low bidder; and

- 1. Contemporaneous execution of a deductive change order totaling \$89,540 reducing the contract value to a total of \$211,000; and
- 2. Documentation from Village of Morganza as to availability of \$20,000 LGAP grant funds allocated to this project; and
- 3. Receipt of concurrence in the contract award from the State of Louisiana, Division of Administration, Office of Community Development; and
- 4. Receipt of Verification of Contractor Eligibility from the State of Louisiana, Division of Administration, Office of Community Development (OCD); and

5. Receipt of approval from OCD of reallocation of \$83,875 from other OCD Budget Line Items to this project (included within this figure is a \$20,000 contingency line item): Therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the contract for said construction is hereby awarded to the low bidder, Neal Construction Company for the Base Bid of \$300,540; and be it

RESOLVED further, That the award of said contract is hereby made contingent upon the following:

- 1. Contemporaneous execution of a deductive change order totaling \$89,540 reducing the contract value to a total of \$211,000; and
- 2. Documentation from Village of Morganza as to availability of \$20,000 LGAP grant funds allocated to this project; and
- 3. Receipt of concurrence in the contract award from the State of Louisiana, Division of Administration, Office of Community Development; and
- 4. Receipt of Verification of Contractor Eligibility from the State of Louisiana, Division of Administration, Office of Community Development (OCD); and
- 5. Receipt of approval from OCD of reallocation of \$83,875 from other OCD Budget Line Items to this project (included within this figure is a \$20,000 contingency line item); and be it

RESOLVED further, That the President is hereby authorized to execute contracts and change orders between the Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury and the successful bidder.

### REALLOCATE FUNDS FROM CDBG-DRA PARISH WIDE DRAINAGE PROGRAM TO CDBG-DRA VILLAGE OF MORGANZA SEWER POND RESTORATION

Grant Administrator Thomas David, III of Pan American Engineers reported and presented the following resolution for approval:

Motion by Mr. Pourciau and seconded by Mr. Young:

WHEREAS, Bids were received on October 22, 2012 for the Village of Morganza's Sewer Pond Restoration project out of funds allocated from the Pointe Coupee Parish Disaster Recovery Program/CDBG, with a Base Bid amount totaling \$300,540; and

WHEREAS, funds allocated for construction total \$150,775; and

WHEREAS, the Base Bid exceeds funds allocated for construction by an amount totaling \$149,765; and in order for the contract to be awarded to the successful bidder, funds within the Disaster Recovery Program/CDBG need to be re-allocated so that sufficient funds are placed in the Village of Morganza's Sewer Pond Restoration project budget line item prior to the award of the contract: Therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the following budget transfer is authorized:

• Re-allocate from the Parish Wide Drainage Program a total of \$150,000 for a total of funds reallocated to be \$150,000.

RESOLVED further, That the Budget Summary Sheet for the Disaster Recovery Program/CDBG for the projects noted be amended as follow, all subject to OCD approval:

# REQUEST LA DOTD TO TRANSFER THE OLD MELVILLE FERRY LANDING TO THE POLICE JURY FOR THE PORT COMMISSION

Parish Administrator Bello reported on a request from the Port Commission asking the Jury to request LA Department of Transportation & Development (DOTD) to transfer the old Melville Ferry Landing to the Jury for the commission.

Motion by Mrs. Vosburg and seconded by Mr. C. Dukes:

RESOLVED, That the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development has abandoned and closed the Melville Ferry Landing in Pointe Coupee Parish; and be it

RESOLVED further, That the Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury hereby requests the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development to transfer ownership of approximately 1775 feet of Louisiana State Highway 10 near the Melville Ferry Landing, between Louisiana State Highway 417 and the Atchafalaya River, to the Parish of Pointe Coupee.

### PAUPER FUNERALS

At the request of Parish Coroner Harry Kellerman, Parish Administrator Bello requested approval of the Jury to advertise for proposals for indigent burial - basic services for pauper funerals in the parish.

Motion by Mrs. Vosburg and seconded by Mr. Pourciau:

RESOLVED, That Parish Administrator Jimmy Bello be authorized to advertise for proposals annually in the official journal for indigent burial - basic services for pauper funerals in the parish.

### TRANSITIONAL DUTY POLICY

Parish Administrator Bello presented and requested approval of the Jury to adopt a Transitional Duty Policy, which provides employees who have an occupational injury/illness, and are unable to return to full duty immediately, with safe, timely, transition from point of injury to temporary transitional position and to return to regular work duties.

RESOLVED, That a Transitional Duty Policy for employees of the Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury be adopted.
