<u>PUBLIC HEARING--2015 BUDGET AMENDMENTS AND 2016 BUDGET OF THE POLICE JURY</u>

As provided for in Act 186 of the 1984 Regular Legislative Session, a proposed budget hearing for amending the 2015 Budget and adopting the 2016 Operating Budget of Revenues and Expenditures of the Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury for the period of January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016 was conducted at 5:33 p.m. on December 8, 2015 in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Courthouse Annex, 160 East Main Street, New Roads, Louisiana.

CPA Jacob Waguespack reported on the hearing to amend the 2015 Budget and adopt the 2016 Budget. He gave a brief overview of the budget.

At the closing of the public hearing, there were no objections received written nor orally.

CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION OF THE 2015 BUDGET AMENDMENTS & 2016 BUDGET

Motion by Mr. Monk and seconded by Mrs. Vosburg:

A resolution amending the 2015 Budget and adopting the 2016 Operating Budget of Revenues and Expenditures

SECTION 1. The Operating Budgets for the years ending December 31, 2015 and 2016 (as attached) are amended and adopted, as summarized for all funds.

SECTION 2. The amendment of the 2015 and adoption of the 2016 Operating Budget of Expenditures is declared to be an appropriation of funds as set forth in the budget classifications and that all expenditure appropriations lapse of each year end.

SECTION 3. Amounts are available for expenditure only to the extent included within this budget.

SECTION 4. The Police Jury is to authorize all line item adjustments of revenues, transfers and expenditures during fiscal year 2016.

SECTION 5. The Police Jury is authorized to make transfers to eliminate fund deficits if existing at year end. Such transfers shall be made from the General Fund and will be approved by the Police Jury if any such adjustments are made.

SECTION 6. To the extent grant and capital project related revenues and expenditures are not realized during 2016, these unrealized but available amounts will be appropriated in the subsequent year budget. The Police Jury is authorized to make said adjustments to grant revenues and expenditures, and capital project related line items.

<u>DISCUSSION & CONSIDERATION OF A STUDY FOR THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM</u>

Juror Monk reported on a proposal received from Patin Engineers & Surveyors, Inc. to perform a study for the National Flood Insurance Community Rating System at a cost of \$25,000.00. The study will give the citizens in the parish a chance to obtain a lower insurance rate. He reported the Finance Committee is recommending asking each Fire District in the parish to allocate \$5,000.00 from their insurance rebate to fund the study.

WHEREAS, it is required by the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development in accord with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the U. S. Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the Applicant that minority business enterprise be utilized to the fullest extent possible in connection with this project, and that definitive procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that minority businesses shall have the maximum feasible opportunity to compete for contracts when procuring construction contracts, supplies, equipment, or consultant and other services: Therefore be it

RESOLVED by the Pointe Coupee Parish:

1. That the President is authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of Pointe Coupee Parish with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development, to aid in the financing of operating and/or capital assistance

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- projects pursuant to the Rural Public Transit Program, 49 CFR 5311 and/or the Discretionary Capital Program, 49 CFR 5309.
- 2. That the President is authorized to execute and file with such applications an assurance or any other document required by the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development effectuating the purposes of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended.
- 3. That the President is authorized to furnish such additional information as the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development may require in connection with the application or the project.
- 4. That the President is authorized to set forth and execute affirmative minority business policies in connection with the project's procurement needs.
- 5. That the President is authorized to execute grant contract agreements on behalf of Pointe Coupee Parish with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development for aid in the financing of the operating or capital assistance projects.
- 6. This resolution is applicable for a period of one year unless revoked by the governing body and copy of such revocation shall be furnished to the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development.

RESOLVED further, That the Police Jury personnel and PC Rec football coaches meet to discuss PC Rec gaining control over gate collections and concession sales at home football games.

PERSONNEL

Chairman C. Dukes reported the Personnel Committee meeting scheduled for December 7, 2015 was cancelled, due to a lack of a quorum. He reported employee Harold Ennis submitted his letter of resignation with the Jury.

RESOLVED, That a letter of resignation from employee Harold Ennis be accepted.

President Bueche reported that Mr. Ennis' employment began with the Jury at the Recreation Department through the Work Release Program while he was incarcerated at the Detention

Center. She reported upon his completion of the program; it was recommended that he become a full-time employee of the Jury. She reported the appropriate disciplinary action was taken, and this matter took longer to resolve because the Jury had only one meeting in November, and was being referred to the full Jury for further action at their meeting in December. She reported no further action is needed, since the employee resigned.

Chairman C. Dukes asked that all department heads obtain a copy of the Media Policy to remind employees about addressing the media.
