MINUTES POINTE COUPEE PARISH POLICE JURY August 23, 2016

The Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury met in regular session at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, August 23, 2016, at the Courthouse Annex in the Police Jury Meeting Room, New Roads, Louisiana.

The Jury offered condolences and prayer to the family of Mr. Paul Mayeux, who passed away. He was the father and father-in-law of employees Dale and Becky Mayeux.

President Cornell Dukes called the meeting to order and directed Secretary Gerrie Martin to call the roll:

As President of the Jury, Juror Dukes will generally abstain unless his vote will alter the outcome on a matter by voting to break or make a tie.

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PRESENTATION OF AWARDS TO VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS & FIRST RESPONDERS OF THE YEAR

Jurors Hurst and Langlois presented the Firefighter/First Responder of the year award to Mr. James Guidry of Pointe Coupee Parish Fire Protection District No. 2.

Jurors Bueche, Cline and Olinde presented the Firefighter/First Responder of the year award to Mr. Ray Barentine of Pointe Coupee Parish Fire Protection District No. 3 with 25½ years of service.

Juror Bueche reported that no names were submitted by Fire Districts No. 1, 4 & 5 and that their presentation of awards will be placed on the next agenda.

REPORT FROM FEMA REPRESENTATIVE

Ms. Bonnie J. Schaaf of Intergovernmental Affairs with FEMA offered her assistance to the Jury and elected officials with flooding issues in the parish.

FEMA Coordinating Supervisor Scott Soraco, along with other representatives of FEMA, gave a brief overview of the flooding of homes in the parish and Louisiana. He gave an overview of registering for financial assistance with FEMA and the various services available to assist the flood victims.

President Dukes thanked all the representatives from FEMA for their assistance in the parish and for attending the meeting.

UPDATE FROM RED CROSS

Mr. Tim Mitchell gave an update and overview of the various services the American Red Cross is providing to support the flood victims in the parish.

President Dukes thanked Mrs. Niki Chenevert and First Baptist Church for assisting the flood victims in the parish with supplies.

CHARBONNET & ASSOCIATES PLANNERS AND CONSULTANTS, INC.

Senior Project Manager/Planner Stephen Peychaud of Charbonnet & Associates Planners and Consultants, Inc. offered their assistance and services as a disaster recovery consultant to the Jury as a result of the recent flooding in the parish.

UPDATE ON SHELTER

Juror Smith gave an update and overview on the operations of the shelter at the Scott Civic Center that housed the flood victims in the parish. He commented on the collective efforts of himself, elected officials and other volunteers who provided assistance at the shelter. He commended St. Mary Catholic Church and First Baptist Church for their collection and housing of supplies for distribution to the flood victims.

Juror Watkins thanked the mayor, mayor pro-temp and employees of the City of New Roads and others for their assistance and working many long hours during the recent flood.

President Dukes thanked the Parish Public Works Director and employees who worked many long hours during the recent flood.

UPDATE ON INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM PHILLIPS & JORDAN, INC.

President Dukes reported on a meeting with representatives of Phillips & Jordan, Inc. informing the Jury that it would not be feasible for them to activate their contract with the Jury for the collection and disposal of debris in the event of a disaster in the parish. He reported they advised the Jury to use one of their local and current contractors to collect the flood debris.

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Floodplain Administrator Cletus Langlois reported upon meeting with FEMA representative today, that the Jury could use a local contractor and approve an addendum to their contract to reflect a reasonable fair market fee comparable to other parishes. He reported since the parish has a small amount (estimated 2,000 cubic yards) of flood debris to be collected, Phillips & Jordan chose not to activate, but would like to retain their remaining five-year contract in the event of any future disasters.

DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION OF LIONEL BOUDREAUX TRUCKING, LLC COLLECTING AND DISPOSAL OF DEBRIS FROM THE FLOOD

President Dukes discussed and asked the Jury's consideration of amending the contract with Lionel Boudreaux Trucking, LLC to include the collection and disposal of debris from the flood in the parish at a reasonable fair market fee.

Juror Cox reported reading on Facebook that Lionel Boudreaux Trucking had started collecting flood debris in the parish on Monday without notifying any Jurors. He questioned who authorized said work without approval of the Jury.

President Dukes stated as president and acting parish administrator he was advised by Phillips & Jordan to make a decision to remove the flood debris off the parish roads, along with an attorney present, he made the decision for Lionel Boudreaux Trucking to commence collection of the debris.

Juror Cox voiced concerns about the president authorizing Lionel Boudreaux to collect flood debris without approval of the Jury, and that the contract with Phillips & Jordan for disaster debris removal and disposal should have been honored. He reported on various problems he has with the president, including decisions he makes without the approval of the Jury and the harassment of employees when they don't agree with him and how he treats them. He commented on the lack of communications with Jurors throughout the storm, no preparations by the Jury, and nothing pre-planned to assist the residents in the parish. He stated proper procedures have to be followed in order to receive reimbursements from FEMA.

President Dukes stated that Mr. Boudreaux agreed to hold his invoices for collecting the flood debris until FEMA reimburses the Jury, with the exception of the tipping fees. He thanked Mr. Boudreaux for this service.

Juror Jarreau commented on proper procedures being followed and reminded Jurors that the Jury previously advertised and awarded a proposal for their disaster debris collection and disposal in the parish. He stated any changes should have been brought to the Jury for approval.

Juror Bueche commented on in the past it was imperative that the Jury following proper procedures in order to obtain reimbursement of services from FEMA in the event of a disaster.

Juror Smith voiced concerns about a possible breach of contract by Phillips & Jordan for not wanting to activate their contract for the debris removal.

Vice President Olinde commented that Mr. Boudreaux currently has a contract with the Jury for the collection of white goods and bulky waste in the parish, and that the Jury should approve Mr. Boudreaux collecting the flood debris.

Motion by Mr. Watkins and seconded by Mr. Taylor:

RESOLVED, That the Police Jury authorize and proceed with Lionel Boudreaux Trucking, LLC for the collection and disposal of the flood debris in the parish, and that the contract agreement between the Jury and Lionel Boudreaux Trucking, LLC be amended to include a reasonable fair market fee for the collection of the flood debris.

Substitute motion by Mr. Cox and seconded by Mrs. Bueche:

RESOLVED, That the Police Jury tabled the issue of the collection and disposal of the flood debris in the parish until a special meeting is held on Thursday, August 25, 2016 with a representative of FEMA, Assistant OEP Director Mark Ward, Assistant District

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Attorney John Wayne Jewell and others to discuss a plan and have proper paperwork about how to move forward with collecting the debris.

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The President called for a roll call vote on the substitute motion that resulted as follows:YEAS:Messrs. Cox, Cline, Hurst, Jarreau, Langlois and Mrs. Bueche.NAYS:Messrs. Bazile, Watkins, Taylor, Smith, Olinde and Dukes.ABSTAIN:None.ABSENT:None.

On a vote of 6-6, the motion failed.

The President called for a roll call vote on the original motion that resulted as follows:YEAS:Messrs. Watkins, Taylor, Mrs. Bueche, Messrs. Smith, Olinde, Bazile and Hurst.NAYS:Messrs. Langlois, Cox, Cline and Jarreau.ABSTAIN:Mr. Dukes.ABSENT:None.On a vote of 7-4-1, the motion carried.

Juror Hurst stated as Jurors moving forward, they need to make sure they take care of business and follow protocol of procedures because every battle they are dealing with they are constantly wasting time.

Juror Smith commented on the Jury reassessing the need to proceed with hiring a parish administrator.

CONCERNS FROM A REPRESENTATIVE OF PECAN ACRES

Ms. Sylvia Williams voiced concerns about the flooding and drainage in Pecan Acres Subdivision.

APPROVAL OF HUMANA MEDICARE RENEWAL

Insurance Agent Claude Jarreau presented the renewal of the Humana Medicare Employer Plan for group health insurance for retirees age 65 and over that included less than \$7.00 a month rate increase.

Motion by Mrs. Bueche and seconded by Mr. Bazile:

RESOLVED, That the renewal of the Humana Medicare Employer Plan for group health insurance for retirees be accepted.

Unanimously carried.

UPDATE FROM H.O.P.E. MINISTRY OF POINTE COUPEE

Director Delores Hurst gave an update from H.O.P.E. Ministry of Pointe Coupee and the assistance they provided to flood victims in the parish. Ms. Hurst reported they have funded the relocation of eight (8) families from the shelter into new homes. She reported on the various services they provided, including the food pantry, assistance with paying utilities bills and rental fees. She reported on the ongoing donations and funding they are receiving to provide these assistance.

UPDATE ON PC COURTHOUSE SAMPLING

Juror Smith gave an update on the Legionella samplings taken from the courthouse. He reported a proposal to conduct a mole exposure assessment of the courthouse will be submitted and the results of the samplings should be available for the next meeting.

UPDATE ON FALSE RIVER

Vice President Olinde gave an update on False River and reported on August 9, 2016, one gate was opened and when the rain event started the water level was at 15.5 ft. He reported the lake August 23, 2016 5

rose to 22.0 ft. on August 15, 2016, the lake crested and is falling 3/10 per 24 hour period and is leaving the Lighthouse Canal and Bayou Sere. He reported all three (3) gates are opened and will be closed when the river reaches 16 ft. Vice President Olinde stated the drawdown of False River is scheduled to begin on September 6, 2016.

In response to Juror Hurst, Vice President Olinde stated he has a passion for False River and did not have a problem, nor is it an inconvenience, checking the gates at the Lighthouse Canal.

Jurors thanked and applauded Vice President Olinde for managing and checking the gates at the Lighthouse Canal.

RENAME OF PRIVATE ROAD FROM LEE DRIVE TO REV. LEA LANE IN BATCHELOR FOR E-911 PURPOSES

Motion by Mr. Taylor and seconded by Mr. Langlois:

RESOLVED, That a private road, Lee Drive, be renamed Rev. Lea Lane at Batchelor for E-911 purposes.

Unanimously carried.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Parish Engineer Kevin Gravois gave an engineer's report and update on the various drainage and road projects in the parish.

Motion by Mrs. Bueche and seconded by Mr. Jarreau:

RESOLVED, That Professional Engineering Consultants Corporation be authorized to advertise for bids in the official journal for the next phase of the Road Maintenance & Rehabilitation Program.

Unanimously carried.

Floodplain Administrator Cletus Langlois gave a detailed update on the flooding in Pecan Acres Subdivision and throughout the parish. He asked Engineer Gravois and Jurors to provide information to him if any culverts needed replacement and any other drainage problems that occurred as a result of the flood. In closing, he thanked the Jury and other agencies for their assistance during the flood.

Juror Hurst thanked Jurors Watkins, Langlois, Bazile and Floodplain Administrator Langlois for covering his district during the recent flooding while he was out of state.

President Dukes thanked the City of New Roads for their assistance to the parish with providing pumps to remove water in various areas during the flood.

Juror Jarreau thanked the mayor and council of the Town of Livonia for their assistance during the flooding in the parish.
