MINUTES POINTE COUPEE PARISH POLICE JURY October 11, 2016

The Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury met in regular session at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, October 11, 2016, at the Courthouse Annex in the Police Jury Meeting Room, New Roads, Louisiana.

The Jury offered prayer for Juror Taylor, who had surgery.

President Cornell Dukes called the meeting to order and directed Secretary Gerrie Martin to call the roll:

As President of the Jury, Juror Dukes will generally abstain unless his vote will alter the outcome on a matter by voting to break or make a tie.

Juror Cox commented on the operations budget for the Multi-Use Center and explained what lead the Finance Committee to make the recommendation to temporary close the center. He announced the Finance Committee will be meeting on Thursday, October 20, 2016 at 5:00 p.m. to discuss this matter further.

Multi-Use Center Director Weldon Jewell made comments about the proposed temporary closure of the Multi-Use Center.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING--AN ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF STRUCTURES ON</u> FALSE RIVER

A hearing to obtain public input to a proposed ordinance for the regulation of structures on False River was held Tuesday, October 11, 2016 at 6:08 p.m. by the Police Jury of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana.

Attorney Dannie Garrett gave an explanation of the proposed ordinance. There were comments from persons in the audience and Jurors. There were no objections received, orally nor written.

CONSIDERATION OF AN ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF STRUCTURES ON FALSE RIVER

Motion by Mr. Olinde and seconded by Mr. Smith:

RESOLVED, That the following proposed amendment to a proposed ordinance to amend and reenact Chapter 6, Article III, Section 6-26 and Section 6-27 of the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Pointe Coupee providing for the regulation of structures on False River and to provide for other matters relative thereto be adopted:

B. No person may operate a boatramp while Pointe Coupee Parish is under a Parish declared state of emergency, when the lake level exceeds 18 feet and shall remain until the level falls below 17.5 feet, or any other time period for which the Police Jury has declared that the operation of a boatramp poses a risk or hazard to persons or property, without the consent of the Police Jury. During a declared state of emergency the authority of the Police Jury set forth herein may be exercised by the President thereof. Nothing herein shall prohibit the operation of a boatramp to save or protect life or property, when in imminent danger. The lake level for purposes of this ordinance shall be declared by the designee of the President.

INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE REGULATION OF LIVESTOCK

Attorney Dannie Garrett, at the request of Juror Taylor, presented an introduction of a proposed ordinance to amend Chapter 4, Article II, enacting Section 4-21.1 of the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana regarding the regulation of livestock for the Jury's consideration.

Motion by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Langlois:

Unanimously carried.

<u>DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION OF A PROPOSAL FROM PROGRESSIVE WASTE</u> SOLUTIONS FOR ONCE A WEEK SOLID WASTE COLLECTION

Juror Cox discussed the potential cost savings to the Jury and decrease in damages to the carts and roads are the reasons a proposal is being considered from Waste Connections Inc., previously Progressive Waste Solutions, for once a week solid waste collection in the parish.

Manager Gus Bordelon presented and discussed a proposal from Waste Connections for once a week solid waste collection in the parish at a cost of \$11 per home, per month. He reported this proposal would generate a savings to the Jury of \$13,840 per month, \$166,080 per year and \$332,160 for the two (2) years remaining on the contract. The current rate is \$12.73 per home, per month for twice a week collection.

Juror Cox reported that in addition to the cost of \$11 per home, Waste Connections is proposing if the Jury consider signing an additional five-year contract renewal they would consider other options. Juror Cox reported that he has asked Waste Connections to present two (2) plans to the Jury for their consideration that would include an option with a reduced cost more than \$11 or a carts replacement system. After a lengthy discussion by Jurors, the following resolution was offered:

Motion by Mr. Cox and seconded by Mr. Jarreau:

RESOLVED, That the proposal from Waste Connections Inc. for solid waste collection in the parish be referred to the Finance Committee for further review; and be it

RESOLVED further, That Public Utilities Supervisor Albert Sneed be authorized to choose an employee from the Public Utilities Maintenance Department to accompany a representative from Waste Connections Inc. to perform a house count in the parish.

Unanimously carried.

CONCERNS OF AN ABANDONED HOUSE ON JACK LOUPE ROAD

Mrs. Diane Guerin voiced concerns about the status of an abandoned house and cleaning of the property on Jack Loupe Road at New Roads located next to her residence.

DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION OF A CONDEMNATION OF AN ABANDONED HOUSE NEXT TO 9857 FALSE RIVER ROAD AT NEW ROADS OWNED BY BRENDA S. JAMES

Juror Smith reported on a public hearing held in July regarding the condemnation of an abandoned house located next to 9857 False River Road at New Roads owned by Brenda S. James. He reported there has been little attempt to clean the property and the need to proceed with the condemnation process.

Motion by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Cox:

RESOLVED, That upon the results of the public hearing and the recommendation of the Parish Building Official, that an abandoned house owned by Brenda S. James located next to 9857 False River Road at New Roads be condemned and demolish; and be it

RESOLVED further, That the Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury hereby orders that an

abandoned house next to 9857 False River Road at New Roads be demolished or removed within 45 days.

Unanimously carried.

INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 8, ARTICLE III, SECTION 8-31 REGARDING THE ASSESSMENT AND REMOVAL OF THE SUNSET DATE OF THE DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE FEE

Juror Cox presented an introduction of a proposed ordinance to amend Chapter 8, Article III, Section 8-31 of the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Pointe Coupee, Louisiana regarding the assessment of the drainage maintenance fee and removal of the sunset date for the Jury's consideration. Juror Cox stated that for 2016 and 2017 the Jury budgeted \$615,000 in sales tax revenues for drainage, has spent \$422,000 in 2016 and it is costing the Jury \$1.1 million for their drainage operations.

Motion by Mr. Cox and seconded by Mr. Langlois:

<u>DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION OF FUNDING AN AD IN THE OFFICIAL JOURNAL AND HOSTING A TOWN HALL MEETING ABOUT THE DRAINAGE IMPACT FEE</u>

Juror Smith discussed and requested approval of the Jury to fund an advertisement in the official journal with a date, time and location to host a town hall meeting to educate the citizens about the drainage impact fee.

Jurors commented on the public being educated and allowed to voice their concerns and any questions at the public hearing that is being scheduled for the amendment to the ordinance for the drainage impact fee in November. After further discussions, the following resolution was offered:

Juror Cox discussed and requested approval of the Jury to give Jurors login credentials to the GPS database.

RESOLVED, That each Juror be given login credentials to the GPS database.

Unanimously carried.

<u>DISCUSSON AND CONSIDERATION OF PROJECTS FOR 2017-2018 CAPITAL OUTLAY REQUESTS</u>

Secretary Martin reported on three (3) requests for submitting applications for a Capital Outlay Request for the False River Ecosystem Restoration Phase II Project, and replacement of the roofs on the Courthouse and Detention Center. Juror Cox included the replacement of the chiller at the Courthouse.

Motion by Mr. Cox and seconded by Mr. Olinde:

RESOLVED, That the Pointe Coupee Parish Police Jury submit applications for Capital Outlay Request for the False River Ecosystem Restoration Phase II Project in the amount of \$2,194,000, replace the roofs on the Courthouse and Detention Center, and replace the chiller at the Courthouse in the amount of \$700,000.

Unanimously carried.

ENGINEER'S AND LAND SURVEYOR'S REPORT

Parish Engineer Kevin Gravois gave updates on various drainage and road projects in the parish, including the Regional Fence Line Monitoring Project being completed and the bids received for the Road Maintenance & Rehabilitation Program.

Land Surveyor Cletus Langlois requested approval of the Jury to authorize President Dukes to sign two (2) letters to the US Corps of Engineers giving them the authority to investigate flooding issues in the parish for possible funding of a proposed drainage project on Portage Canal, and appointing Cletus Langlois as the point of contact for said project.

Motion by Mrs. Bueche and seconded by Mr. Smith:

RESOLVED, That President Cornell Dukes be authorized to sign two (2) letters to the US Corps of Engineers giving them the authority to investigate flooding issues in the parish for possible funding of a proposed drainage project on Portage Canal, and that Land Surveyor Cletus Langlois be appointed the point of contact for said project.

Unanimously carried.

He reported that improvements to the levees in Pecan Acres and Pleasant View Subdivisions have been completed. He gave an update on the ground testing in Pecan Acres Subdivision, and collection of the flood debris has been completed.

UPDATE ON FALSE RIVER

Vice President Olinde gave an update on False River, and reported the water level is 12.6 feet, a drop of 18 inches in two (2) weeks. He reported that LA Wildlife & Fisheries deposited 314,000 Bluegill Breams (1½ to 2 inches long) in the river. He asked everyone to use extreme caution when traveling in the river because of the low water.
