\$2 million road improvement project underway

Pointe Coupee Parish's annual road improvement program has expanded in 2026, with the parish spending \$2 million on road rehabilitation and overlays before the end of the year. The first phase of the project is underway now, and phase 2 is expected to bid in August and begin in late September. Projects are prioritized using an independent road assessment to ensure roads in the worst condition are repaired first. The 2026 program includes 52,000 linear feet of road milling and overlay. Pointe Coupee Parish government has invested \$3.8 million in road improvements between 2025 and 2026 to improve transportation across the parish. Since 2019, a total of 194 parish roads have been improved, with a total of 188,262 square yards of overlays.

Major drainage projects underway across the parish



The parish is continuing major drainage projects to improve water flow in significant rain events. The Bayou Grosse Tete and Bayou Chope clean out project, costing \$4.9 million, is about 75 percent complete. It will benefit the south end of the parish. In addition, the parish has just started the \$1 million clean out of Johnson Bayou, which will benefit the north end of the parish. These waterways have not been cleared of vegetation and debris in decades. The projects will improve drainage in two-thirds of the parish. Seems like deadlines and important dates drive almost everyone's routine. Students, businesses and news people all have deadlines to meet. The Assessor's office has a few important dates and deadlines that we must adhere to complete our yearly work.

FIELD CREW WORK ON ASSESSMENTS

The field crew is out collecting data and taking photos to update our files for accurate property listings. Office staff is processing property transfers from sales and conveyances; and values are being calculated on real estate and personal business property.

IMPORTANT DATES FOR TAXPAYERS to note are:

OPEN BOOK period is August 17-31. This is a 15-day period for taxpayers to review their assessments to discuss values or notify us of any changes before the tax roll is finalized.

This period is also a great time to check for any exemptions or special assessment level benefits that you may qualify for.

*Homeowners may qualify for Homestead Exemption, Special Assessment level for homeowners over 65 who meet certain income requirements, or Special Assessment Exemptions for homeowners who are permanently disabled or disabled Veterans.

First responders who live in the parish that is their agency headquarters, may qualify for an additional exemption as well. Please note the First Responder exemption must be certified annually by their agency head.

So even though we have deadlines, our staff will always answer questions and assist you in making sure your assessment listing is accurate and that values are fair and equitable.

DA's Office to provide sheriffs with crime fighting technology

Sheriff's Offices in Pointe Coupee, Iberville, and West Baton Rouge Parishes will soon have new technology to help them respond to crime and emergencies, all thanks to District Attorney Tony Clayton.

Working with the sheriffs of the three parishes to help meet their technology needs, he is purchasing 12 license plate readers for the Pointe Coupee Sheriff's Office; three high-tech drones for the Iberville Sheriff's Office; and four drones and a robot dog for the West Baton Rouge Sheriff's Office in two-year cooperative endeavor agreements.

DA Clayton has worked closely with law enforcement agencies in Pointe Coupee, Iberville, and West Baton Rouge since being elected, but he is enhancing the partnerships with law enforcement by funding these needed resources to fight crime and develop stronger cases.

"This technology will assist these agencies in a number of ways," DA Clayton noted. "The the license plate readers requested by Sheriff Rene' Thibodeaux will greatly assist in making crime arrests and providing a stronger case for prosecution of crimes. The drones enable monitoring of suspected drug hangouts and active crime scenes, which will provide critical information to deputies and also make responding to these crimes safer. They also are very helpful in telling deputies what they will encounter before they get to a crime or accident scene, and in search and rescue situations." The high tech drones are equipped with thermal imaging and AI-assisted navigation.

"Spot," a remote-controlled robot, will be going to West Baton Rouge in the second year of the agreement.

Sheriff Rene' Thibodeaux said, "I want to sincerely thank District Attorney Tony Clayton for purchasing the license plate recognition cameras for Pointe Coupee Parish. These cameras are an invaluable investigative tool, helping law enforcement quickly identify vehicles connected to criminal activity, locate stolen vehicles, and generate critical

leads in cases that might otherwise go unsolved. This investment strengthens our ability to protect our citizens, and we're grateful for District Attorney Clayton's continued partnership in making Pointe Coupee Parish a safer place to live, work, and raise a family."

"I told the residents of the 18th Judicial District when I asked for the tax to fund the DA's Office that I would increase technology to fight crime, and this is one way we are doing that," DA Clayton said. "We have a great working relationship with our law enforcement partners, and I expect these technology upgrades to enhance our crime fighting activities in all three parishes."

"I want to make it clear that the drones will not be used for surveillance of neighborhoods. They will be used at crime scenes and any evidence collected by the drones will be used toward prosecution. We know where the gang and drug dealers havens are and we are coming after them," DA Clayton said. "Additionally, they will be used as a crime prevention tool during public events, like festivals, football games and other events. All of this technology helps make our communities safer."



Interns Visit Hunt Correctional Center – District Attorney Tony Clayton has summer interns working on a variety of administrative tasks this summer, but he took time to bring them on a tour of Elayn Hunt Correctional Center in St. Gabriel in early June. The interns will also visit La. State Penitentiary at Angola during the summer.

Parish to upgrade utility metering system

A \$5.1 million project to modernize and transform the current utility metering system from manual reads to automated meter reading will begin in the latter part of 2026. The parish has accepted Aqua Metric for the installation and implementation of the automated metering infrastructure project. "This solution is built specifically around the Parish's goal: dependable and efficient reads across both utilities, delivering accuracy and efficiency to our customers," noted Parish President Major Thibaut.

The project, which has been in the planning stage for the last year, will be funded with a low interest loan from the Department of Environmental Quality, which allows a significant portion of the loan to be forgiven as the project moves to completion. In addition, the parish has secured \$600,000 in state capital outlay funds to help fund the project.

Several utility systems across the state have converted to advanced metering infrastructure solutions and have experienced great results by replacing the manual meter reading systems.

WATER DISTRICTS NOW CONSOLIDATED...

Pointe Coupee Parish Water Districts #1 and #2 have officially consolidated to form the Consolidated Water District #1 of the Parish of Pointe Coupee. The districts will receive a total of \$6.2 million for three major infrastructure improvements, including system upgrades necessary to ensure long-term reliability, regulatory compliance and improved service delivery. Pointe Coupee Parish Government began governing the consolidated water district on July 14, 2026.

Another clean audit

Pointe Coupee Parish Government received an unmodified audit opinion for the year ended December 31, 2025. An unmodified opinion provides a reasonable level of assurance from the auditor that the financial statements present a true and fair reflection of an entity's results for the period reported. The parish has received an unmodified opinion for the last seven years -- a result of strong ethical accounting and the practice of sound financial policies and procedures.

Soccer field improvements underway

Work on the new soccer field configuration at False River Park is underway. Improvements at the park in 2026 include complete renovation of the soccer complex, re-positioning and re-grading fields, adding irrigation and sod, installation of more than 500 linear feet of sidewalk to connect the Scott Civic Center and soccer complex, and the construction of another restroom building in the south side of the soccer complex.

New emergency op plan proves effective

The parish's new Emergency Operations Plan was put to the test in Tropical Storm Arthur, which hit the northern part of Pointe Coupee particularly hard on June 17 and 18. The storm dumped over 17 inches of rain in that area in less than 24 hours.

"The emergency plan was followed and worked well," said Emergency Operations Director Stephen Dabadie. "The coordination prevented chaos." He noted that the new plan was funded by a federal grant and matches state and federal emergency guidelines. In addition, the parish holds mock emergency drills regularly. "This was an unforecasted rainfall amount that impacted some of our residents, but severe weather events are happening more now, and it is critical that we have an effective plan and are prepared to implement it," Dabadie said.

Economic development plan advancing

A new Pointe Coupee Parish economic development strategic plan is now being finalized, but the parish has already put it to use in analyzing potential development sites, matching the parish with possible projects, and submitting for regional development projects.

New Economic Development Director Adam McCloskey has already met with state agencies and other regional partners, and is advancing the marketing pieces of the new strategic plan. A new economic development website and other materials are expected to be live and in use by this fall.



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Digital siren implemented in Pointe Coupee

Pointe Coupee Parish Sheriff René Thibodeaux is pleased to announce the successful completion of the Digital Siren public safety notification system throughout Pointe Coupee Parish.

This innovative technology provides real-time alerts to motorists and nearby residents when a law enforcement vehicle is actively engaged in an emergency response or vehicle pursuit. The goal of the Digital Siren system is to improve public safety by giving citizens immediate notification so they can remain alert, avoid the area when possible, and help create a safer environment for everyone involved.

“When deputies are responding to emergencies or involved in a pursuit, every second matters,” said Sheriff Thibodeaux. “The Digital Siren system gives the public another layer of awareness that can help prevent crashes, reduce congestion, and ultimately protect lives.”

The system works by sending audible and visual alerts through participating navigation and safety applications on smartphones. Drivers using compatible apps will receive notifications that an emergency vehicle is approaching or that a pursuit is occurring in their vicinity.

The Pointe Coupee Parish Sheriff’s Office encourages all residents to download and enable one of the supported applications to take full advantage of this safety feature.

How to receive Digital Siren alerts

- Download the Waze app on your smartphone.
- Make sure location services and notifications are enabled.
- Keep the app updated to the latest version.

Citizens may also download the Digital Siren app:

- Search Digital Siren in the Apple App Store or Google Play Store.
- Enable notifications and location permissions during setup.

By using these applications, residents can receive important emergency notifications that promote safer roadways and improve awareness during critical incidents.

The Pointe Coupee Parish Sheriff’s Office remains committed to utilizing innovative technology to enhance public safety and better serve the citizens of Pointe Coupee Parish.

Wound care team helps patient get back to active life

Arleen Dixon was referred to the Pointe Coupee General Hospital Wound Care Clinic after seeking help for a wound on her left leg. About a year prior, she had been diagnosed with pyoderma gangrenosum, a rare condition causing painful skin ulcers.

At her first appointment at the Wound Care Clinic, she met treating provider Summer Zettlemoyer, NP, who in partnership with the wound care team, promptly began treatment.

First, the team ensured Arleen had optimal blood flow to her left leg. Then, treatment included wound cleansing, applying appropriate wound dressings, offloading and debriding, or removing dead tissue from the wound. Throughout every step of Arleen's healing journey, the team was mindful of the other medical issues she was dealing with.

The staff also educated Arleen on tips to optimize her diet for healing, keep her wound clean and prevent falls. In addition, they also made sure she understood how the treatments were helping her heal.

After three months of treatment, Arleen was discharged from the Wound Care Clinic completely healed and with all goals met.
